# 8.5.86 TRINIDAD PICKFORD CUP FINAL. DEAN COURT

We met our bogey team in the final but despite the historical bad results against Junidad, Verwood's squad were confident of reversing the trend. A massive plus was Junidads linesman Butler sitting in the stand and not officiating.

The opening exchanges were scrappy as both sides tried to settle down and it was evident that both teams had decided on tactical marking with Steve Norman being policed by Funidad CH. Dunning whilst Martin Shutler took on the task of keeping Finiolads top marksman Judgett under control.

Mike Eyres produced the first piece of controlled football taking down a high ball and operating a one-two with Steve Richards. Jony Phanoah overlapping on the right collected Eyres pass and a byeline cross was narrowly headed wide by

Martin. A shorp Junidad break produced a themendous Ashley long save and Miller provided good cover from another dangerous cross. Gradually the game settled down to an entertaining game with the play flowing end to end. Ginerra looked cool with clever defensive cover and a sound back four performance prevented Junidad from taking the initiative.

The second half opened with a bang - after 21/2 mins. Paul Martin pivoted 30 yards out and unleashed a ferocious shot which dipped under the bar. a combined R.W. counter attack was checked by Shuller before Miller had to display his heading ability keeping a dangerous high ball out of the box. The Pharoah twins were playing well with Marlin op--erating on the left and Jony on the right. 14 mins. into the second haif, Richards sent away Joster. "Fossies" wur to the box was a delight, and a clever left foot cross found Martin - a head back into the area, a nod on by Norman and there was Richards to steer home a third header to put Verwood two up. The most dangerous period for a team is just after they've scored and so it proved with Verwood as they were carried on a euphonic ware. Gradually the storm was weathered and with 15 mins. to go foster broke away going narrowly wide with a left foot rocket: 2 mins. later Eyres Tried a long shot which had the keeper scrambling on the R.H. post. With only 3 mins. left Jundad snatched the equaliser when a L.W. cross

wasn't picked up and a 20 yard right foot shot beat Long. Extra Jime saw two sets of tired legs but still the football was end to end. Gose calls from both forward lines kept the crowd or their toes. Steve Norman found a little bit of 100m but a strong tackle just inside the box deried him the shot. There was no straky start to this replay as both leams settled immediately to some fire football. ### FOUL OR ABUSIVE LANGUAGE

Law I2 (0) states that, "a player shall be sent off the field if, in the opinion of the referee, he uses Foul or Abusive Language".

The Football Association has issued a reminder of this Rule, and they, together with the Dorset County F A request Clubs and Match Officials to remember their responsibilities in ensuring that this Law is applied correctly in order that this unpleasant aspect of football is eliminated.

BOURNEMOUTH F A have recently circulated a note suggesting that Clubs warn their players of the possibility of **TETANUS** infecting a flesh wound with serious results. Players are therefore advised in their own interests to check on their initial and booster treatment against this infection.

Club annual subscriptions, also covering the monthly Draw are now due from all members.

Dear Sirs,

The International Football Association Board, at its meeting on 30th May 1986 in Mexico City, took the following decisions regarding amendments to the Laws of the Game and Universal Guide for Referees. These amendments are to come into force on

### 25th July 1986

with the exception of the National Associations in whose countries the football season does not commence until the coming year. However, for all other international competitions or tournaments, these amendments and/or decisions are valid as from 25th July 1986.

### 1) LAW III - Number of Players

#### Present text

- 5. When a goalkeeper or any other player is to be replaced by a substitute, the following conditions shall be observed:
- a) the Referee shall be informed of the proposed substitution, before it is made;
- b) the substitute shall not enter the field of play until the player he is replacing has left, and then only after having received a signal from the Referee;

- 5. When a goalkeeper or any other player is to be replaced by a substitute, the following conditions shall be observed:
- a) the Referee shall be informed of the proposed substitution, before it is made;
- b) the substitute shall not enter the field of play until the player he is replacing has left and then only after having received a signal from the Referee:

- c) he shall enter the field during a stoppage in the game, and at the half-way line;
- d) a player who has been replaced shall not take any further part in the game;
- e) a substitute shall be subject to the authority and jurisdiction of the Referee whether called upon to play or not.
- c) he shall enter the field during a stoppage in the game, and at the half-way line;
- d) a player who has been replaced shall not take any further part in the game;
- e) a substitute shall be subject to the authority and jurisdiction of the Referee whether called upon to play or not.
- f) the substitution is completed when the substitute enters the field of play, from which moment he becomes a player and the player whom he is replacing ceases to be a player.

<u>Reason:</u> There appears to be some confusion as to whether a substitution is <u>completed</u> at the moment the player being substituted leaves the field of play, or when the substitute actually enters the field of play, or when the ball becomes next in play. The new text is to clarify this situation.

#### 2) LAW XIV - Penalty-Kick

#### Present text

A penalty-kick shall be taken from the penalty-mark and, when it is being taken, all players with the exception of the player taking the kick, and the opposing goalkeeper, shall be within the field of play but outside the penalty-area, and at least 10 yards from the penalty-mark. (...)

#### New text

A penalty-kick shall be taken from the penalty-mark and, when it is being taken, all players with the exception of the player taking the kick, properly identified, and the opposing goalkeeper shall be within the field of play but outside the penalty-area, and at least 10 yards from the penalty-mark. (...)

Reason: If the player who is about to take a penalty-kick is properly identified, i.e. is recognizable both to the referee and the goalkeeper, it will prevent any other player from his team from taking the kick instead of him, as has been the case when a player has taken the kick from some distance, leaving the penalty-area and the arc of the circle to do so.
