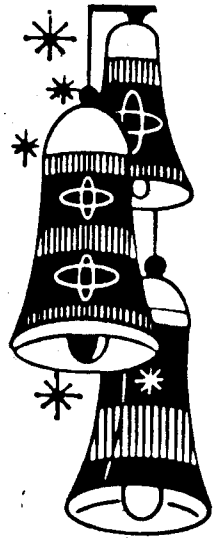

## CLUB HISTORY

Verwood is steeped in history. A notable spot for visitors is the Monmouth Ash Public House which is said to be built on the site where the Duke of Monmouth hid in a tree to avoid his pursuers. Can we believe the rumour that he was the first referee to officiate at a Verwood F C match?

The first written records date back to the late 1920's, and a copy of the notice to Dorset FA confirming ground directions and club colours indicate that we have a similar colour scheme now. Then, Verwood played in white smock, red gaiters and clogs. We now of course wear white gaiters.

Until 1986 the clubs home games were all played on the recreation ground except for a short period of time when a piece of spare ground near Coronation Road was used. This in fact was the best period in the clubs playing record as we were unbeaten in two years. The club secretary forgot to tell the opposition we had moved!

According to long established club members and ex-players travelling in and around Dorset by steam train - changing under and/or behind well layed hedge rows proved conducive to team spirit and offered a different slant to Country Life!

During the war years matches were organised against teams from the home guard West Moors Army Barracks, Woodlands Searchlights, but the team they enjoyed playing most of all was against the Land Army.

De-mob saw explayers reunited and the club continued it's affiliation to Dorset re-establishing it's winning ways bringing minor and junior trophies to the village. This also bought back the local hostilities particularly the annual battle against Cranborne. Memories recall one particular game when police were called in from Wimborne to control the crowd and restrain the reverend Williams from striking the referee with his walking stick. Fortunately we don't get that sort of trouble anymore. We don't get a crowd!

Moving from Dorset FA to Bournemouth FA gave us a chance to broaden our horizons. The early 1960's saw some of the club officials involved with the village youth side, Rossgarth YFC. It's heartening to see that the link has not only been maintained but last years first team sported 9 players who had "come through the ranks".

The ambitious move to Potterne, and a strong willing committee has bought the club to Hampshire Football For the first time in it's 60 years of history. Growth of the village is reflected in our new name Verwood Town Football Club and having secured sponsorship from local businesses we are confident of maintaining a profile befitting the status.

The Potterne Bowl staged the game of the season as two classic teams confronted each other. The crowd, well policed, well behaved (excluding the autograph hunters) rose as one as the nominated Captains (oldest player on each team) Mike Guy and Bernard Scott led out their teams:-

Verwood kicked off with a slick move between Richards and Andrews allowing the latter to head for goal but clever defensive play by Pegram linking with Hudson broke up the attack. A high ball into midfield brought the "engine room" battlers into play and Scott using majestically headed Richards knees giving away the first foul of the day. A taking Byres free kick brought Lock into action but the cross was headed away by Shervington. Rossgarth attacked swiftly on the right with Wells winning a

corner. Long caused havoc in the area forcing Shakeshaft to head across the box only for Scott to pop up between the blades of grass and slam a left foot shot into the net.

William Hills upon hearing the score reduced the odds and changed betting to Verwood 1-10 Rossgarth 10-1.

Stung, Verwood sprang into action with the Vaseline streaked Shakeshaft surging forward sending a high ball to Eyres, an interchange between Guy and Richards and danger threatened. Easedown though reading the game well flashed across the box knocking the ball back to driving.

Wells and the Long brothers were causing Verwoods defence lots of problems. Earth, surprisingly, still awake did magnificently in the 30<sup>th</sup> min.

in blocking an Ashley Long run, then feeding a back pass to young England hopeful Easedown jr.

In the 37<sup>th</sup> min Long was rewarded for his persistence netting Rossgarths second with a timely tackle in the area from which the ball re-bounded into the roof of the net. 43 mins and Ashley Long ripped between Shakeshaft and Earth firing a good shot into the bottom corner of the net.

The scorching first half pace took its toll and Reg Day handed over the whistle to the young, fresh faced, Mike Dry.

The rule book was consulted and it was decided that Rossgarth should play the second half with 11 men giving their 12<sup>th</sup> to Verwood so that both sides had equal numbers.

Although Scott had showered that morning it was a unanimous Rossgarth team vote that he be the transfer party.

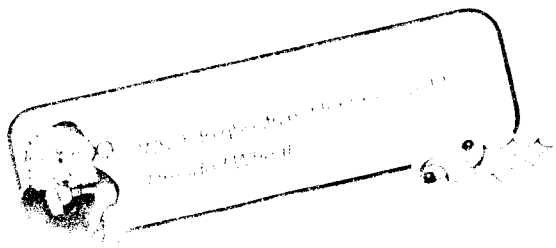
Shakeshaft seizing the opportunity of the extra man shot off to centre forward position, never to return.

The second half opened with Ross-garth still pressing forward with Wells and the Long brothers causing Verwoods defence problems. Nick Long intelligently interpassing with Guy opened up a gap but Easedown jr was equal to the cross. Stuart Guy's vicious "studs up" tackle on Scott allowed Atkins to to send a long free kick to Eyres but a timely Barkham tackle stopped the attack. Verwood were gradually getting on top and some fine play between Lock Andrews and Richards opened up Ross-garth once again but Easedown srr. and Hudson did well to block the route to goal. Garth stopped Ashley Long's run on the left and a fine pass to Atkins set up Verwoods attack. Atkins side-stepping his man slipped the ball to Scott, a long high ball to Shakeshaft, a nod to Lock, a cross ball and there was Parker to score a left foot cracker past a bewildered Diving. 2 mins later and Eyres drove a fine shot at goal which a bleary-eyed Diving did well to collect. A battle followed between Shakeshaft and Diving but between the post and a lucky day Diving came out on top. The pace was killing and became fiercer after Eyres unleashed a right foot rocket to make it 3-2. In fact Diving was still diving as we kicked off again. Mike Guy the cultivated architect of mid field prompted his men forward yet again but Ross-garth were equal to the onslaught and cool Barry Morris stepped into the limelight with a neat interception sparking off

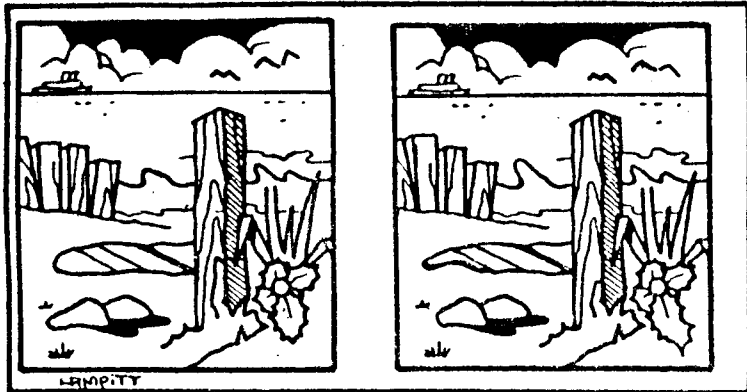


a Rossgarth counter attack. An Easedown cross threatened but Scott leaping high clearing the grass headed out. Richards collecting the loose ball dummed his man and sent out a ball to Lock. Then he sent out a search party as no one could find him. A minute later released from the iron lung Lock dazzled the opposition with a speedy mazy run. It would have been even better had he remembered the ball. A Tony Parker left foot shot almost made it 3-3 but Pegan struggling to keep awake fell over just at the right time to block the shot. The game sea-sawed but with Atkins now emerging as the dominant figure supported well by Earth and Easedown jr for Verwood and the defensive wall of Rossgarth - Hudson Pegan Barham Morris and Shervington both attacks found difficulty creating chances. The final whistle went with the score 3-2 in Rossgarths favour.

## FIRST TEAM MATCH REPORTS

### 7.12.90 Flight Refuelling Res. (H) Dorset Snr Cup

Flight's experienced side bottled us up and frustrated the attacks we put together. We lacked intelligence on the day though, falling sucker to allowing Flight's time on the ball and centralising play. Nick Long fought hard and we did have a spell in the first half when Nick's running, supported by the industrious <sup>martin</sup> Pharoah, almost brought a goal. In the 49th minute the inevitable happened as we got caught on the break and were punished by a good goal. The second half produced more flair and we started to prise open Flights but our finishing was abysmal. A complacent spell settled in and we suddenly went two down as yet again we allowed a dangerous Flight's forward time and space to put our opponents two up. Alan Bingham's fighting spirit brought hope and with Simon Guy battling for everything we quickly reduced arrears when fine football from the back brought Gale on to the scene for a superb cross to be headed home by Martin Pharoah. From then on it was one way traffic as we pushed and probed to get an opening. Mark Bingham's close range shot was well turned away and Gale's thunderbolt inched over the bar. Adie Arnold joined the attack in an effort to get the leveller but it was not our day and in the 91st minute Flights caught us stretched and a ~~ball~~ shot went over Ashley's advancing figure into the net.

Last time we met New Milton we fell apart defensively in the second half and suffered a heavy defeat 3-1. We decided on a new formation for the game but our hopes and aspirations were dashed at the kick off when Shaun Phillips failed to arrive. We kicked off with ten men and although having two excellent chances in the opening couple of minutes failed to score. New Milton, clearing their lines in the 6th minute, hit a high ball that fell in our half and a lone forward could not believe his luck as he found himself unattended and slipped the ball past Ashley Long. Andy Barham came on straight away and almost broke through with his first involvement but was felled

outside the box. We played some delightful football, good one twos and had New Milton back-peddalling. Martin Pharoah was again on song, linking well with Simon Guy and Shaun Gale. 27 minutes into the game and our sustained attack paid off as Gale's one two with Pharoah produced an opening and Pharoah's left foot cross shot hit the net. New Milton came back at us but found Alan Bingham and Adie Arnold too strong. The odd long ball hit into the area was capably handled by Ashley Long.

The second half was a replica of the first as we "gifted" New Milton a goal from a bad back pass. New Milton's best spell of the game followed as they hammered us. We defended well and again it was Ashley Long's two terrific saves that saved the blushes. We threw caution to the wind pushing Simon Guy to outside right and bounced back into the game. Mark Bingham's new role in midfield seemed tailor-made as he fought for everything and being complimented by Andy Barham's skilful contribution opened up New Milton but pathetic finishing kept us in arrears. Sloppy covering in the 70th minute allowed our opponents to go three up but an immediate fight back produced a penalty from which Shaun Phillips coolly slotted VIFC's second. It was a thrilling finish as we battled to draw level but New Milton held out for a 3-2 victory.
